



# Could you help at Leighton Hospital?

Have you ever been in hospital? Were you bored? Did the time drag? What about weekends with even less going on? Would you have liked a change of scenery for an hour?

One way for patients to break the Sunday morning monotony is to attend the church service in the hospital chapel, and for some it is just that, a "boredom buster" but staff agree that after being cooped up on the ward, a change really is as good as a rest. For others the service means much more. It provides a vital link back to their own church families, a chance to sing well known hymns, say familiar prayers and have some sense of normality on a Sunday.

All people of all denominations are welcome to worship at the chapel, Doctors, Nurses, Staff and Visitors, but the only way that Patients are able to attend is by being collected in a wheelchair by a volunteer as the number of Porters has been drastically cut on Sundays.

Would you consider being a volunteer? We really need more people to help.

Could you be One person willing to give up Two hours to push an average of Three patients to and from the chapel just Four times a year? or could you go round the wards making a list of which patients want to attend the service?

# Operation Christmas Child reaches nearly 10 million

Samaritan's Purse has reported that for Christmas 2013, almost 10 million gift-filled shoeboxes were shipped to needy children around the world through Operation Christmas Child. Well over 900,000 shoeboxes were donated by individuals, groups, churches, schools and workplaces here in the UK.

Samaritan's Purse spoke of its "gratitude" to the hundreds of thousands of people who donated shoeboxes in the UK, and to the thousands of volunteers and supporting

Last year, at St Mary's & St Luke's, we donated over 60 shoeboxes

organisations, up and down the country, who helped collect and send the shoeboxes on their way. This year, for the first time, gift-filled shoeboxes were sent from donors in the UK to children in Rwanda. In 2014, Rwanda marks the 20th anniversary of the genocide that saw almost one million people killed in 100 days.

### **Easter Faith**

Three years after the Russian Revolution of 1917, a great anti-God rally was arranged in Kiev. The powerful orator Bukharin was sent from Moscow, and for an hour he demolished the Christian faith with argument, abuse and ridicule. At the end there was silence.

Then a man rose and asked to speak. He was a priest of the Russian Orthodox Church. He went and stood next to Bukharin. Facing the people, he raised his arms and spoke just three triumphant words: 'Christ is risen!'

At once the entire assembly rose to their feet and gave the joyful response, "He is risen indeed!" It was a devastating moment for an atheist politician, who had no answer to give to this ancient Easter liturgy. He had not realised he was simply too late: how can you convince people who have already experienced God, that he does not exist?
