

What is The Bible Course?

A course produced by The Bible Society prepared by Andrew Ollerton.

It consists of 8 Sessions to explore the big picture of the Bible story from Genesis to Revelation.

Each session has an explanatory video with Teaching, Discussion and Reflection. Each session lasts about an hour

The Bible can be difficult to read and understand, especially the Old Testament . The course shows us how the Old Testament starts the story preparing the way through to Jesus birth, life, sacrifice and resurrection, on to Revelation and God's promise for us today and beyond.

Andrew Ollerton who leads the sessions is a clear speaker, with an easy to understand presentation, full of interesting ideas. helping people to read the Bible for themselves.


The course has been run twice at St.Mary's and all attending have found it enjoyable, learning many new things.
