

BOOKING DETAILS FOR SEPTEMBER

To book a place at a service please call the person below (the phone number by the date). Bookings can only be taken on a weekly basis, no advance or block booking is allowed. Feel free to call from the Monday prior to the Sunday you wish to attend, up to the cut off point of 7pm Friday Evening. If you get an answerphone then please leave your name, phone number and how many are attending from your household. Someone will only call you back if there's a problem. We are giving priority to those who can't attend online worship, however it is on a first come, first served basis.

We are not implementing a booking system for the 10am midweek communion (beginning 16 September) at this point as we think we can fit the usual attendees in. There will be no refreshments after services for the time being.

COVID-19 GUIDANCE FOR ATTENDING CHURCH

1. There is a booking system in place - we may not have room for you if you haven't booked.
2. It is vitally important that you understand your own clinical risk before you attend a physical services in church. The NHS has guidance available to help you assess this.
3. You should not attend if you have any Covid symptoms or you are in a high risk category.
4. You should keep a distance of 2m from people not in your household.
5. Face Coverings are mandatory in church unless you have a valid medical exemption. Those leading the service or reading a lesson do not need to wear a face covering, but will do at times.
6. On arrival, be prepared to wait with distancing to be shown into church. Please do not linger in the porch on entry or exit. We will be asking for details for track and trace purposes if this hasn't been given at the time of booking.
7. You must sanitise your hands (or wash then in the basin in the toilet) on arrival and on leaving. You are welcome to bring your own 70%+ hand sanitiser for your own use.
8. You will be shown to a pew, please don't move about the church unnecessarily. Members of the same household may of course sit together.
9. Liturgy will be on the screen with some single use sheets available when possible.
10. Music, including songs and hymns, may be played in some services. Please do not sing.
11. Government guidance states that there should be no shouting or raised voices.
12. Communion is in one kind, the bread. At the administration of Communion, please do not leave your pew until guided to do so. Observe distancing carefully, use sanitiser, and observe the one way system back to your pew. The priest will have sanitised hands, wear a face shield, and place the wafer into your open hands without any hand to hand contact, and without words. The wafers will have been covered prior to this point and not spoken over.
13. At the end please leave promptly keeping a 2m distance from other households and do not congregate in church to talk.
