

War Memorial Centenary Project

We held an Open Afternoon on Saturday 10 November in St Mary's Church, 2pm - 3.30pm, to launch the War Memorial Centenary Project which will commemorate the centenary year of the end of WW1. This project will give safer access for all to the War Memorial in the churchyard at St Mary's with new paths, a safer area to view the memorial and lay wreaths with a railing and a better paved area around the memorial. We are working in partnership with Wistaston and Rope Parish Council.

The There But Not There

The Rector secured a grant from the Armed Forces Covenant Trust to get 6 transparent 'silhouettes' of military figures to use at the War Memorial Centenary Project to remember the 16 young men of Wistaston who gave their lives in World War 1. The figures are called 'There But Not There" and we used the 'silhouettes' at the launch event for the War Memorial Project and at our Remembrance Sunday Services on 11th November.
