#### A reading from the Book of the Prophet Malachi

'I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come,' says the Lord Almighty.

But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the Lord will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the Lord, as in days gone by, as in former years. This is the Word of the Lord.

#### **Gospel Reading: Luke 3:1-6**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you O Lord.** 

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar — when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene — during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet:

'A voice of one calling in the wilderness,
"Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.
Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low.
The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth.
And all people will see God's salvation."'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

#### **Nantwich Based Listening Service Seeks Volunteers**

Do you have a heart for the bereaved? Do you have an hour or two free a week and would you like to use it to help others? Insights Bereavement Listening Support Service is a new initiative following research in our local area which has revealed a desperate shortage of support for those affected by bereavement. Insights is being supported by The End of Life Partnership, Nantwich Town Council and the National Lottery.

As a completely volunteer-led group, we are looking for compassionate people who are willing to undertake brief training to become a listening volunteer.' An enhanced DBS will be paid for by Insights. The listening can take place in a booked room, in a client's home, outdoors on a walk, or even over the phone/Skype, according to client and volunteer preference/availability. Clients receive 8 – 10 sessions depending on need, although some clients feel so much better after 1 or 2 sessions that they finish then.

#### **Bereaved?**

Have you lost a loved one? Would it help to talk to someone? Self-referrals to this free service welcome. (Listening sessions take place in Nantwich.) Your loss does not have to be recent...often we need to talk about things that happened years ago as much as those very recent losses.
