The Lockdown Birthday

Celebrating a birthday in lockdown was certainly very different from what birthday celebrations people before. Some have celebrated two birthdays in total lockdown. Others in slightly more freedom. All of us will have had a birthday in Covid times. Thinking birthdays about started me reflecting on the birthday of the church, known as Pentecost. This is always the 7th Sunday after Easter. The reason that Pentecost is seen as the birth of the church is that it was on that day that the Holy Spirit, one part of the Holy Trinity fell upon Jesus' disciples as he had promised. It is quite an exciting moment as the Holy Spirit arrived with tongues of fire and a rush of wind. Something amazing happened, the disciples were able to speak in languages. Maybe you are one of those people who tried a language learning app during lockdown, if you are you know you don't learn a new language in an instant. The disciples, full of the power of God in them, did just that. On that day they found a new confidence to speak about their faith in Jesus and the love they had found in God. quite lt was something, people thought they were drunk! Which is quite amazing

as the pubs weren't open then either, it was only 9am! What is even more amazing is that on that day 3000 people heard the love which the disciples spoke of were and joined the church - hence the birthday. It is great that as a church we are open for the church's birthday this year, albeit in a limited way, we would love you to join us online and help us celebrate. First Reading: Acts 10.34-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

This is the Word of the Lord.

Gospel Reading: John 15.1-8

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. **Glory to you O Lord.**

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

For the past two years the Wistaston Scout Group have displayed their impressive 24ft long Remembrance Day poppy cascade outside their Scout Centre in 2019 and Wistaston Memorial Hall in 2020. The cascade was made of dozens of plastic bottle ends painted red to resemble poppies. For November 2021, the Scout Group has an even more ambitious display planned for a new, yet to be announced, location in Wistaston. To donate, please cut off the bases from plastic bottles, at about 1.5 inches up from the base of the bottle and deposit them in the plastic bottle end collection point on the Wistaston Memorial Hall car park on Church Lane in Wistaston.
