

Mike writes... July 2015



Dear friends.

As we move into the holiday period I'd like to share something of the sermon I preached on Sunday 19 July which a few people have spoken to me about. Here are a few points from the sermon.

Text: Mark 6.30,34-53,56 "When we think of an imitation we may think of illegal copies of things, watches, jewellery, art, fashion, something that is not real or perhaps more accurately, genuine, and we'd be correct. But there is a positive side to the word imitation that perhaps we don't consider that often. A look in the dictionary gives us this definition: the action of using someone or something as a model.

So who is it that you imitate who is your role model if you like? As children it may have been our parents, as teenagers it may have been the latest film, sport or music star. But we grow older, we mature. So today, who is your role model? Who do you pattern your life upon? Who do you imitate? Who inspires you?

Up to now we've thought of other people being these things to us, but as Christians, Jesus should be our role model. Imitating Jesus should be the essence of our lives. We should pattern our lives after Him. We should imitate Him in all that we do.

In His earthly life, Jesus was fully human and fully divine. On his human side He experienced all the feelings that we do. There were times when he was tired. There times when He was exhausted, physically and mentally. In today's reading from Mark we get to know Jesus on a human level. We see a Jesus who needed time to himself.

There were times when Jesus desired to withdraw from the crowds. We, too, should sometimes withdraw from the pressures we may have in our lives. Jesus was under continuous strain and needed rest. We, too, should take time to rest. In addition, Jesus needed time for prayer. And so we should set time aside for prayer."

I hope you have a great summer and also get some time for the above.
