
Confirmation Service 2015



The New Bishop of Stockport

The new Bishop of Stockport – and the first woman bishop in the history of the Church of England – is the Revd Libby Lane. Libby's appointment was

announced on Wednesday 17 December.

Aged 48, Libby is married to the Revd George Lane, 46, who is the co-ordinating chaplain at Manchester Airport. They have two adult children.

Libby was consecrated as the 8th Bishop of Stockport at a ceremony at York Minister on Monday 26 January 2015. The Bishop of Chester, the Rt Revd Dr Peter Forster, said: "Libby has had a varied and distinguished ministry, and is currently a first-rate parish priest. She has already demonstrated her ability to contribute nationally through her representative role in the House of Bishops, on behalf of the north-west England dioceses.

"As the first woman bishop in the Church of England she will face many challenges as well as enjoying many opportunities to be an ambassador for Jesus Christ. I have no doubt that she has the gifts and determination to be an outstanding bishop."

Bishop Libby will be with us at St Mary's on Sunday 7 June at 6pm for our Confirmation Service.



Our Branch Leader Jenny Hall writes:

The Mothers' Union is an international Christian charity with over 4 million member in 81 countries worldwide. The members are not all mothers or even all women, but single, married, parents, grandparents or young adults just beginning to express their social conscience, who are confirmed in the Christian faith and support our Vision and Aims and Objects.

The organisation provides a network through which members can serve Christ in their own community - through prayer, financial support and actively working at the grassroots level in programmes that meet local needs. We lobby local and national governments on issues affecting family life and campaign to challenge legislation that neglects the vulnerable and marginalised. We are also represented at the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women since 2000.

In the Chester diocese our members helped to establish the Macclesfield Contact Centre for families that are divided. We attend Wedding Fairs, provide a Mother and Baby Facility at the Cheshire Show, run Parenting Courses, help visitors to the Young Offenders Prison at Thorn Cross, fund the Away-from-it-all holidays for families who have experienced domestic violence or who may just need time to reassess the family unit. Two of our deaneries run the Virtual Baby scheme which are

taken into schools (year 10, 14 to 15 year old girls and boys), the children explore the reality of looking after a baby for the weekend.

We have received funding from Comic Relief for the Literacy and Financial Education Programme this enables some of the most marginalised communities in the world to meet Millennium Development Goals of reducing poverty, increasing the participation of women and girls in education and employment, tackling HIV/AIDS and improving family health and relationships. The groups are open to everyone, crossing the boundaries of religion, age, gender or tribe. Thus offering opportunity for business development, and setting up community savings and loan groups, as well as participating in household decision making, community politics and leadership.

The "Buy buy Childhood" campaign has been ongoing since August 2010 to challenge the commercialisation and sexualisation of childhood as we believe that children should be valued as children not as consumers, yet marketers target children in order to reach the household purse. Our CEO, Mr Reg Bailey was asked by the Prime Minster to look into this aspect and we are now seeing the recommendations of the Bailev Review being implemented. It has gained support from across the different party MP's, engaged with regulatory bodies, advertising and media organisations and other charities concerned about the issue.
