

# Malcolm writes... February 2016



I was sat thinking recently that it seems to be ages ago since we were celebrating Christmas with all its excitement. Lent is the Christian preparation for Easter and follows Christ' example when he spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting, praying, meditating and trying to get closer to God.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent is 40 days long, these days do not include the Sundays in Lent.

In ancient times candidates for

baptism or confirmation were received into the membership of the Church at the main Celebration of the Resurrection on Sunday morning.

Lent evolved as a time of

prayer and study and preparation for those being initiated into the church on Easter Sunday. The candidates prepared themselves to become a part of the Body of Christ by repentance, selfgiving, and turning and walking with Jesus in the way of the cross. It was also used as a time for those who had been excluded from the church because they were not living a Christian life, to come back into communion with Christ and the church. /cont on Page 4

It has become a regular practise during Lent in most churches to hold some form of course to help us make our newer stronger commitment to and to get closer to Christ and is certainly the practise here at St Mary's and St Luke's. 
