Poppies were taken by people for a donation and some were made into the Wreath. The donations, for the Royal British Legion, totaled £231.00"


On the evening of Monday 4th August we had a very moving service around the War Memorial in the churchyard, again remembering by name those on the War Memorial who gave their lives during WW1.







We sat and listened - a celebratory ring, _ And thanked Frank, John and James for the joy they all bring;
