Revd Mike writes



On the 6 January we celebrated the Epiphany at which we remember the visit of the wisemen/magi/kings to the baby Jesus. Of course, the story of the Epiphany is told in the famous carol written by John Henry Hopkins Jr. in 1857, We Three Kings. The chorus tells us of a star of wonder that appeared at night to guide the kings to the Jesus.

The word Epiphany means appearance or manifestation, God makes known or "manifests" the birth of His Son to the whole world. The season of Epiphany draws our attention to the universality of Christ's birth. The Christ-child was visited first by the shepherds and, as Matthew 2: 1 – 12 tells us, sometime later he was visited by the wise men. The shepherds came from the nearby places surrounding Bethlehem and so represent the people of Israel. The wise men or "magi" came from far away,

probably Persia, they are gentiles and so represent the whole of humanity.

Towards the end of the passage we are told that first thing the magi do upon entering the stable and seeing Mary and the Child is to kneel and worship him. In other words, they give themselves. Only after this act of worship, only after giving themselves to Christ, only then do they present their material gifts. The material gifts have both symbolic and sacrificial value. Each one tells us something about the Christ-child. Gold was precious and worthy of a king; frankincense was incense worthy of a divinity; and myrrh was a spice used in burials. So, the gifts were appropriate for one who was a king, a God, and a suffering redeemer.

As we move into a new year, let us do as the magi did. Let us give the gift that they gave – let us give ourselves fully to God, let us respond to God's love in Christ in deed, worship & prayer, knowing that whatever the year brings, we are in God's hands.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to Samaria. When they arrived, they prayed for the new believers there that they might receive the Holy Spirit, because the Holy Spirit had not yet come on any of them; they had simply been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John placed their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you O Lord.

The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.



Every Church of England parish is being asked to engage with Living in Love and Faith (LLF) and to send feedback to the Archbishops by the end of April this year.

The Purpose

The purpose of LLF is to inspire people to think more deeply about what it means to be human and to live in love and faith with one another and offers a variety of ways to learn, reflect and pray together. The five-session course provides a structured and accessible way for groups to learn about and reflect on questions of identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage.

The Book

The book takes readers on a journey that begins with reflections on God's gifts of life, relationships, marriage and learning. A survey of what is happening in the world with regard to identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage is followed by an exploration of how Christians are to understand and respond to these trends in the light of the good news of Jesus Christ. The book then examines the ways in which Christians seek to hear God and how it is that they draw different conclusions.

The book closes with an appeal from the Bishops to join them in discerning a way forward for the church that is open to new vistas on our disagreements and new perspectives on our differences.
