

## An update re Ceri Palmer née Howells Memorial Fund for CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young)



Robert, Alison and Joel would like to say a very big thank you to everyone who has supported this vital cause, since Ceri died on 28 March 2014. She tragically

died in her sleep of a sudden arrhythmic death (SADS). CRY know that at least 12 young people are dying of this hidden condition **every week** in the UK alone. **80%** of people who die from this condition often exhibit no obvious symptoms prior to the event.



Various fundraising events have been held so far such as 'The Grand Day Out' when well over £2000 was raised, a Weleda Ladies Pampering Event, a Harp Duo concert at Richmond Village and also funds from Richmond Village's Christmas Raffle, a Decibella Ladies Choir concert, CRY Cake Bakes in various venues, the Macclesfield Half Marathon (ran by Ceri's Aunty) and the CRY Heart of London Bridges Walk, to name but a few.

Currently the Head of 6<sup>th</sup> Form, John Harrison, at Malbank High School (where Ceri was a student) is training for the Wilmslow Half Marathon for Ceri's Memorial Fund. To date at least £8,000 has been raised in Ceri's memory.

A CRY Memorial Heart Screening (for 14-35 year olds) will be held at Malbank High School in Nantwich in June 2018 and a further one at South Cheshire College, date in 2018 TBC. Dates, venues and information about CRY Heart Screenings are posted on <a href="www.testmyheart.org.uk">www.testmyheart.org.uk</a> These screening sessions have been proven to reduce the risk of death from the condition by almost 89%.

This much needed service is funded purely by donations and funds raised by bereaved families and supporters. Many young lives are being saved by CRY's vital work, one of whom is a student who is studying at South Cheshire College, who discovered they had a serious hidden heart condition at a local screening last year and subsequently were fast tracked into NHS Cardiology services to require the correct treatment to save their life.

CRY is campaigning to ask MPs to recognise the significance of at least 12 young people dying every week of young sudden cardiac death. We strongly urge you to contact your MP to request they sign a pledge to support a National Strategy for the Prevention of Young Sudden Cardiac Death to help save young lives as in the following link:





## **Annual Parochial Church Meeting**

#### What is it & who's it for?

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) is effectively the AGM of the church. It is a legal requirement for a charity to hold one, but more than that, it gives an opportunity for the church to come together and rejoice in what we've been able to do in God's name over the past year.

Two weeks before the APCM a Trustee and Financial Reports booklet will be available at both churches and online. This has information and reports to keep you informed on the what's been happening at church over the past year. The report also has an examined set of accounts for the previous year.

The APCM is for all those who attend our churches on a regular basis. Only those who are on the Electoral Roll of the church can vote, if there are any issues to vote upon, but all are welcome to attend.

We usually finish the APCM with a Bring and Share Fellowship lunch, a great opportunity to share a meal together and enjoy each others company more than we do each Sunday.

If you are on the Electoral Roll of the church, and have been for at least 6 months, then you might be interested in one the following offices within the church who are elected or appointed at the APCM.

Forms for each of these are available at both churches

#### **PCC**

Members of the Parochial Church Council are Trustees of the church under Charities Commission law and make decisions to do with Mission, Ministry, Finance & Maintenance

#### Deanery Synod

Deanery Synod is often seen as the link between PCC's & the Diocesan Synod. It also thinks about ways to work together within the Deanery

#### Sidesperson

It's more than just giving out books! Sidespeople play a vital roll each Sunday by assisting the Wardens in welcoming people into church and making sure that everything runs smoothly
